Arrival

All campers are expected between 4:00 and 5:30 p.m. on Sunday, March 3.


Please park near the **Julien-Raymond pavilion** (**cafeteria**) and head there to meet the camp manager, first-aid attendant and administrative coordinator.

Please:

- Provide ALL medication to be taken on an as-needed or regular basis, whether prescribed or not*.
- Inform staff, if applicable, of any medical conditions your child may have that were not already mentioned when registering online.
- Pick up your online purchases or get a product from the boutique.

Then, please go to your designated chalet where you can meet your child's counselor and choose a room and bed. Campers and their families are free to explore the site until 6 p.m., when supper will be served to campers in the cafeteria.

*If your child brings non-prescription medication in his or her luggage, the chalet counselor will ask him or her to hand it over so that he or she can note its distribution during the stay.



Departure

Parents and friends are invited to the end-of-camp concert, which will take place on site on **Friday, March 8 at 2 pm**. Please park near the reception desk or cafeteria, then head for the chapel.

After the concert (around 3 p.m.), accompany your child to his or her chalet to pick up his or her luggage, which will already be ready.

Don't forget to:

- Collect ALL luggage
- Check that your child has not forgotten anything (indoor shoes, boots, clothes in the chest of drawers, toiletries in the bathroom).

Frequently asked questions

If the health situation deteriorates, can I cancel and get my money back?

Should Public Health directives make it impossible for campers to participate, the stay will be refunded on a pro rata basis for the remaining days. Please refer to the *Refund and Cancellation Policy*.

Do you manage the use of prescription drugs?

Yes, the counselors will do it if necessary, or even the Health Supervisor, as the case may be. Parents must complete the health form when registering for the activity to ensure proper care. For further details, please consult the <u>Procedure for the distribution and administration of medicines</u>.

How do I reserve my child's room so that he can be with his friends?

The Camp allocates campers to chalets according to age and gender, and tries to accommodate pairing requests made on the registration form. The choice of rooms and beds is left to the discretion of campers on a first-come, first-served basis. When you arrive, campers can reserve a room and bed, and set up their personal belongings in it.

What level of proficiency is required to take part in the camp?

We welcome young people of all levels. Although a basic knowledge of the instrument is preferable, we occasionally welcome motivated beginners. Lessons are private and young people are not in competition with each other.
