# Other information



In order to fully enjoy the stay, the CMPL offers a disconnected environment to campers. It is therefore **forbidden to bring electronic devices such as cell phones or tablets**, except for those with a single function (e-reader, metronome, camera, instrument tuner, etc.). **The Camp assumes no responsibility in the event of loss.** 



No pets are allowed on the Camp musical site. Please leave them at home or in your car.



IMPORTANT: For reasons of hygiene and allergy risk, campers may not bring sweets or snacks into the cabins. Meals brought in because of allergies will be kept in the cafeteria.

## Arrival

#### All campers are expected **between 3:30 p.m. and 5:15 p.m. on the opening Sunday of the session**.


An instructor will be at the entrance to the site to welcome you, show you where to park and which chalet to go to. There you can meet your child's counselor and choose a room and bed. Campers and their families are free to explore the site until 5:30 p.m., when supper is served to campers in the cafeteria.

At the chalet, please hand in ALL medication to be taken on an as-needed or regular basis, whether prescribed or not. **If your child brings non-prescription medication in his/her luggage**, the chalet counselor will ask him/her to hand it over so that he/she can keep a record of its distribution during the stay.

Please pass under the tents near the cafeteria for:

- Meet with the chief of camp\*, first-aid attendant or administrative coordinator;
- Inform staff, if applicable, of any medical conditions your child may have that were not already mentioned when registering online;
- Collect your online purchases or buy a product from the store.

## Parents' visit

Mid-camp Sunday Parents are invited to visit their children during their stay, on mid-camp Sunday. On this occasion, a musical gathering is scheduled for 11:30 a.m., either in the auditorium or outside. For your comfort, we recommend that you bring beach chairs. In case of rain, or depending on the program, the gathering could also take place in the auditorium. This day is a great opportunity to bring what you need to picnic at Camp musical with your child, or to go off-site for a family activity. Please note that the cafeteria is reserved for staff and campers only. Campers must be back by 4:45 p.m., and parents by that time. Counselors will organize activities for campers whose parents are unable to visit.

#### Concert

The teachers' concert, held on the 2nd Wednesday of the stay, is another great opportunity for family and friends to visit the campers, depending on the epidemiological situation at the time. Admission: \$10/person (free for the camper).

## Departure

Parents and friends are invited to attend the **end-of-camp concert at Saint-Alphonse-Rodriguez church** on the last Saturday of the camp. Please park near the reception desk or cafeteria, then head to the chalet to pick up your luggage, which will already be ready.

Don't forget to:

- Collect ALL luggage
- Check that your child has not forgotten anything (indoor shoes, boots, clothes in the chest of drawers, toiletries in the bathroom).

ITEMS FOUND DURING THE TRIP WILL BE ASSEMBLED IN THE CAFETERIA. BE SURE TO TAKE A LOOK!

Note: No lost items can be sent by mail.

Then it's off to the church at **960 Rue Notre Dame, Saint-Alphonse-Rodriguez, QC JOK 1W0** by 10:45 at the latest. The concert starts at 11 a.m. and finishes around 12:30 p.m. The program will include choral and orchestral tunes, as well as some campers' performances.





## Frequently asked questions

#### If the health situation deteriorates, can I cancel and get my money back?

Should Public Health directives make it impossible for campers to participate, the stay will be refunded on a pro rata basis for the remaining days. Please refer to the Refund and Cancellation Policy.

Do you manage the use of prescription drugs?

Yes, the counselors will do it if necessary, or even the Health Supervisor, as the case may be. Parents must complete the health form when registering for the activity to ensure proper care. For further details, please consult the <u>Procedure for the distribution and administration of medicines.</u>

How do I reserve my child's room so that he can be with his friends?

The Camp allocates campers to chalets according to age and gender, and tries to accommodate pairing requests made on the registration form. The choice of rooms and beds is left to the discretion of campers on a first-come, first-served basis. When you arrive, campers can reserve a room and bed, and set up their personal belongings in it.

What level of proficiency is required to take part in the camp?

We welcome young people of all levels. Although a basic knowledge of the instrument is preferable, we occasionally welcome motivated beginners. Lessons are private and young people are not in competition with each other.
