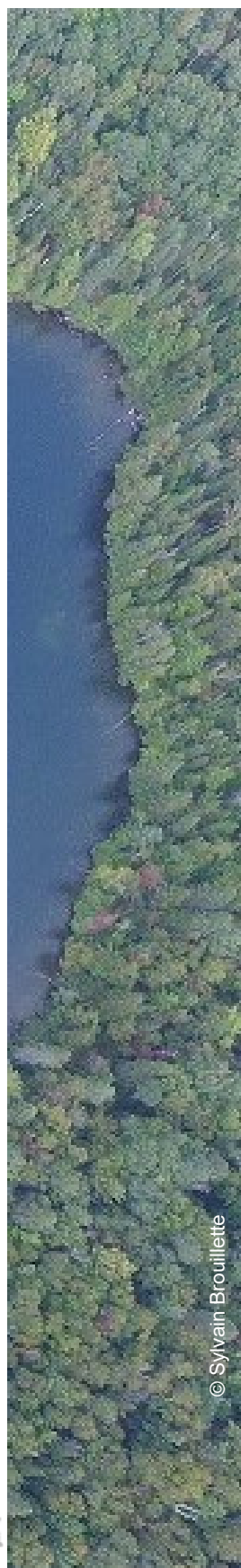

*Please note that there are no laundry facilities available to campers and their families. Please bring enough clothing for the entire stay or arrange to exchange clothing during the mid-camp visit.



Other information



We encourage you to use soft travel bags rather than suit cases to optimize space in the cabins.



Electronic devices are prohibited, with the exception of single-function devices such as metronomes, e-readers, etc. ***The Music Camp accepts no responsibility for lost or stolen items.***



No pets are allowed on the Music Camp grounds. They must be left at home or in the car.



IMPORTANT: For hygiene and allergy reasons, campers are not allowed to bring candy or snacks into the cabins. Meals brought for severe allergies will be stored in the cafeteria.



Correspondence: You may send a letter or postcard to your child at ***100, rang Petit Beloeil, Saint-Côme, Quebec J0K 2B0***. We cannot guarantee that he or she will receive it before the end of the stay.



Not needed at camp except for the purchase of stamps or promotional items: Stamps (\$1.10), Envelopes (free), T-shirts, sweatshirts, towels, pillowcases.

Arrival

All campers are expected to arrive between **3:30 p.m. and 5:15 p.m. on the Sunday of the session start date.**

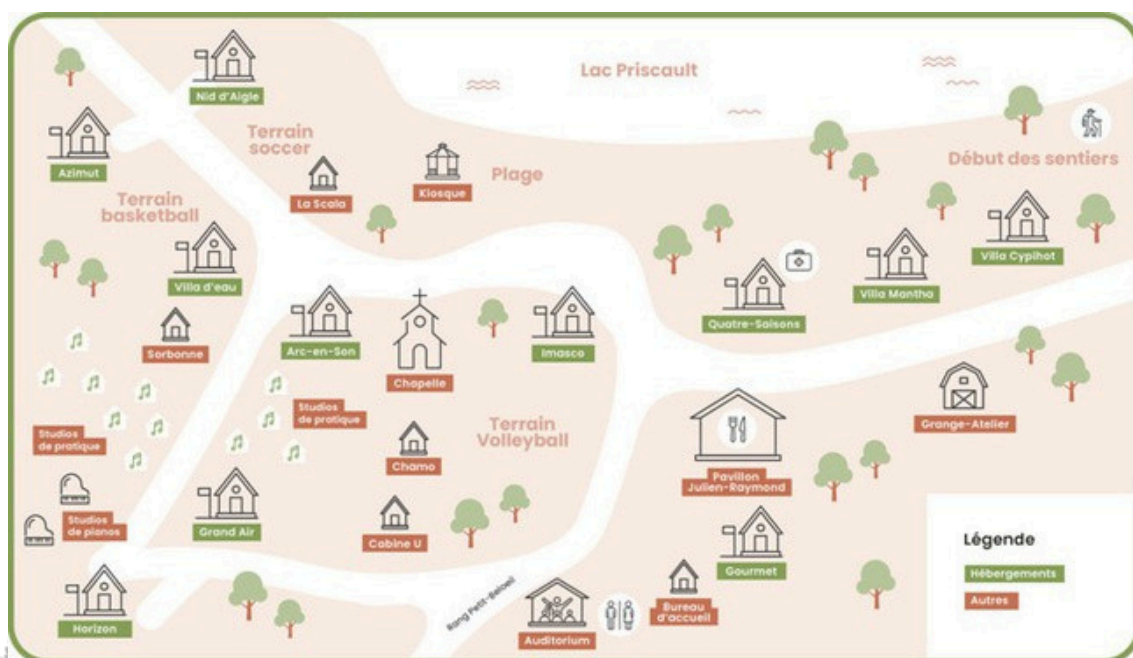
A counselor will be at the entrance to welcome you, show you where to park, and direct you to your cabin. There, you can meet your child's counselor and choose a room and bed. Campers and their families are free to explore the site until 5:30 PM, when dinner will be served in the cafeteria.

At the cabin, please hand over ALL medications that need to be taken as needed or regularly, whether prescribed or not. **If your child brings non-prescription medication in their luggage**, their cabin counselor will ask them to hand it over so that they can keep track of it during their stay.

Please stop by the tents near the cafeteria to to:

- Meet the camp director, first aid officer, or administrative coordinator.
- Inform staff, if necessary, of any medical conditions your child may have that were not already mentioned during the online registration process.
- Pick up your online purchases or buy something from the store.

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Parent visit

Mid-camp Sunday

Parents are invited to visit their children during their stay on mid-camp Sunday. A musical gathering is planned for 11:30 a.m. in the auditorium or outside. For your comfort, we recommend that you bring beach chairs. In case of rain or depending on the program, the gathering may also take place in the auditorium. This day is a great opportunity to bring everything you need for a picnic at Music Camp with your child or to leave the site for a family activity. Please note that the cafeteria is reserved for staff and campers only. Campers must be back by 4:45 p.m. and parents must have left the premises by that time. There will be activities organized by the counselors for campers whose parents are unable to visit.

Reminder: pets are not allowed.

Concert

The teachers' concert, which takes place on the second Wednesday of the stay, is another great opportunity for parents and friends to visit campers, depending on the epidemiological situation at that time. Admission: \$15/person (free for campers).

Departure

Parents and friends are invited to the end-of-camp concert, which will take place at ***Saint-Alphonse-Rodriguez Church on the last Saturday of the stay***. Please park near the reception desk or cafeteria, then head to the chalet to pick up your luggage, which will already be ready.

Don't forget to:

- Pick up ALL of your child's luggage
- Check that your child has not forgotten anything (indoor shoes, boots, clothes in the dresser, toiletries in the bathroom)

ITEMS FOUND DURING THE STAY WILL BE COLLECTED IN THE CAFETERIA. BE SURE TO CHECK THERE!

Note: Lost items cannot be mailed.

Then you will all head to the church located at ***960 Rue Notre Dame, Saint-Alphonse-Rodriguez, QC J0K 1W0*** by 10:45 a.m. at the latest. The concert begins at 11 a.m. and ends around 12:30 p.m. The program will feature choir and orchestra pieces, as well as a few performances by campers.



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Frequently Asked Questions

How do you handle food allergies?

The Music Camp offers an nut- and peanut-free environment. For other food allergies or intolerances, please indicate this on the registration form. In the case of overly complex allergies, the Camp reserves the right to ask parents to provide prepared meals to ensure the well-being and safety of the child. These will be stored in the cafeteria.

Do you manage prescription medication?

Yes, the counselors do as needed, or even the care manager, depending on the case. For more details, please refer to the *Procedure for the Distribution and Administration of Medication*.

How can I reserve a room for my child so that he or she can stay with friends?

The Camp assigns campers to cabins based on age and gender and tries to accommodate roommate requests made on the registration form. The choice of rooms and beds is left to the discretion of the campers on a first-come, first-served basis. Upon arrival, campers can reserve a room and bed by placing their personal belongings there.

What level of skill is required to participate in the camp?

We welcome young people of all levels. Although it is preferable to have a basic knowledge of your instrument, we occasionally welcome motivated beginners.

The classes are private and the young people do not compete with each other.
